



This week I was working on the Center of the labyrinth. It represents a rose, and is made up of six petals, the petals being formed each by a single large rock surrounded by white and blue, blue-green, and patterned shards. The color white is symbolic for the Holy Spirit, being especially effusive in the center. And going out from the center, all along the pathway, here and there pieces of white shard, or intimations of the Holy Spirit accompany the walker.

The color blue stands for Hope. Likewise, there is a profusion of that color in the Center, and here and there also some of those shards are scattered along the pathway. Shards of various other colors represent that we are persons from all different nationalities, backgrounds, faiths; in short, they represent inclusivity of our diversity.

My feeling about the use of shards is to present that we are all "broken" people, imperfect in various ways, on the way to seeking wholeness on our journey home with God. Each individual is also "broken off" from large family, and loved ones. You may have other meaningful ideas about it. Lydia Martin
